Absolutely no latex or oil-based paint will be accepted at any of the HHW events. To dispose of paint:

- In a well-ventilated area; air dry paint away from children and pets.
- Add absorbent material; such as shredded newspaper or kitty litter and **allow to dry completely**. Some home improvement stores may sell an inexpensive paint hardener (*check your local stores*)
- Throw the dried paint away in your regular trash
- If paint has solidified in the can, take off the lid and dispose of it in your regular trash
- Or you can donate 'good' leftover paint to local community groups, theater groups, schools, churches and others who need or want it. You may even be able to take a tax deduction. Your local Habitat for Humanity Re-Store will also accept good used paint.

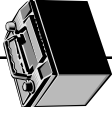
