Then, we talked about potential strategies of where we could see improvement in those previous strategies and if we wanted to get rid of them altogether.

Page 1 – *Table of Contents*

At the bottom of Page 1 is a note stating that all hyperlinks will be highlighted in a gold color if you are looking at it online. See Appendix I for links to websites.

Page 2 – *Executive Summary*

Page 3 – *Executive Summary* – Explains the process and the MAPP process explaining the 6 phases.

Figure 1.1 – Priority Topics and Priority Outcomes that relate to the Priority Topics

Page 4 – Partners are listed. This page can be edited. If you are not listed, please let Lori know and your name will be added.

Page 5 – Vision, Values and Definitions of Health

Pages 6, 7 & 8 – Alignment pieces that we have been discussing: The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services National Prevention Strategies, Healthy People 2020, Ohio State Health Improvement Plan (SHIP). On page 6, there is a small picture of the state of Ohio. This symbol will be used in the report when a priority, indicator or strategy directly aligns with the 2017-2019 SHIP. Any time you see the state symbol, we are aligning with what the state is working on.

Page 7 – *Executive Summary* – Figure 1.1 2019-2022 Delaware County CHIP Alignment showing that we align with MH and Addiction and Chronic Disease. We have the priority outcomes that the state is measuring and we also will be measuring in this report.

The cross-cutting indicators may be changing depending on the strategies that we choose.

The cross-cutting factors will remain the same: Social Determinants of Health, Public Health System, Prevention and Health Behavior & Healthcare System and Access

Chronic Disease may change as well.

Note at the bottom of page 7: The checkmark symbol will be used throughout the report when a strategy has been rated by “What Works for Health.”

Page 8 – *Alignment with National and State Standards*

State Health Improvement Plan Overview

This breaks down where we should be aligning with the indicators.

Page 9 – *Strategic Planning Model*

Here are all of the steps that we have taken to get to the 4th CHIP Planning meeting.

Pages 10 & 11 – Listed are all of the different strategies that are in today’s report. MH & Addiction – broken down by Mental Health & Addiction; Chronic Disease and Cross-cutting strategies. These strategies came about from our gap analysis in our last meeting.

Page 12 – *Needs Assessment* – All of our key issues and concerns where we ended up ranking our top keys issues and concerns to get our priority topics.

Page 16 – The priorities that we chose. Not a new document. A table of where we ended up ranking for our average scores.

Pages 17 thru 19 – Community Themes and Strengths Assessment which was also completed during our second meeting.

Pages 20-21 – *Local Public Health System Assessment* – The Health District pre-scored all of those local public health system assessment forms. This document is over 100 pages. Lori Kannally has it and can be contacted if you would like to see the full results of the Local Public Health System Assessment. On the “Summary of Average ES Performance Score” diagram at the bottom, the black lines represent the average responses—the range of the responses that were given for that specific essential service. The actual report explains this in more depth. **Action item: Emily will incorporate an explanation explaining the black lines at the bottom.**

Pages 22 & 23 – *Forces of Change Assessment* that we completed that was part of the MAPP Process.

Page 24 – *Quality of Life survey results* - We had 1,036 respondents who completed the survey! Ninety-five percent of survey respondents currently lived in Delaware County. This is more than our top county! We asked where our respondents lived, so if you have any specific requests to break down this data, we can do so. Let Lori Kannally know if you would like to see this. We also asked for subdivisions. We are doing subdivision profiles so we will want to look at that. work with each of our subdivisions and
